Strategies for Presuming Competence:

- 1. Know your learners
- 2. Set short-term goals
- 3. Utilize the Goldilocks principle
- 4. Build on the learner's strengths
- 5. Make expectations explicit
- 6. Provide praise at 7:1 ratio
- 7. Use positive language
- 8. Don't give the correct answers
- 9. Don't just tell what they've done wrong
- 10. Give longer response time
- 11. Always remember behavior is communication
- 12. Provide equal response opportunities
- 13. Be intentional with personal interactions
- 14. Treat as you do a typical peer
- 15. Use effective teaching strategies
- 16. DO NOT EVER GIVE UP!
